### **❖ Daylight Saving Time ends November 5<sup>th</sup>.**

What is the true reason for Daylight Saving Time and why doesn't Arizona observe? The first DST began in Germany on May 1, 1916 in the hopes that it would save energy during WW1. However, they probably got the idea from Great Britain and their reason had nothing to do with conserving fuel. In 1907, William Willett published the Waste of Daylight. He stated that he had an epiphany early one spring morning. "The sun shines upon the land for several hours each day while we are asleep and there remains only a brief spell of declining daylight in which to spend the short period of leisure at our disposal." It did mention it would save money not using artifical lighting, but his main purpose was to have more daylight enjoyment. He lobbied Parliament to pass a law, which was passed in 1915. In the US, our government passed the DST law on March 19, 1918. The reason stated was for fuel conservation. The US Chamber of Commerce backed the policy, but for the reason that people would get off work earlier and be more likely to go out shopping in the evening. Golf ball sales skyrocketed and the National Baseball League was an early supporter because there were no lighted ballfields. However, the movie industry was not in favor of it because people were less likely to go in a dark theater when it was light outside. Farmers did not advocate DST unlike popular belief. They said "it's taking us off God's time." It was so unpopular, that it was repealed during WW1. It was reinstated in 1942. However, NYC did not comply but the rural areas did observe DST. People were missing their trains because of the confusion. In 1966, the Uniform Time Act was signed by President Johnson, saying six months of DST and six months of standard time.. States were allowed to opt out, which Arizona did, stating it didn't make sense since it was over 100 degrees already. (AZ Republic March 1969) Hawaii also does not observe stating temperate climate.

There was a brief trial of year round DST in 1973. It failed because people were concerned about children getting hit by cars in the dark. It was later changed in 1986 to seven months of DST. Golf and barbeque manufacturers claimed was worth between \$200 million and \$400 million. Since 2005, the US observes eight months of DST. In 2008, the US Department of Energy reported that there was a 0.5% decrease in total electricity use per day. So, Willett's point holds true, an extra hour of daylight is enjoyable. 


